## **List of Acceptable Identification Documents**

Each borrower and/or guarantor must present for examination one of the following:

- One piece of identification ID from List "A" AND one piece of identification
- or ID from List "B"
  - Two pieces of identification ID from List "A"

## List A (These documents must contain a photograph)

- Valid driver's license issued in Canada
- Current Canadian passport
- Certificate of Canadian Citizenship
- Permanent Resident Card
- Certificate of Indian Status issued by the Government of Canada
- A provincial or territorial identification card, with the individual's photograph, issued by any of the following (or their successors):
  - the Insurance Corporation of British Columbia;
  - Alberta Registries;
  - Saskatchewan Government Insurance;
  - the Department of Service Nova Scotia and Municipal Relations;
  - the Department of Transportation and Public Works of the Province of Prince Edward Island;
  - Service New Brunswick;
  - the Department of Government Services and Lands of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador;
  - the Department of Transportation of the Northwest Territories;
  - the Department of Community Government and Transportation of the Territory of Nunavut.

## List B

- Birth certificate issued in Canada
- Old Age Security card issued by the Government of Canada
- Canadian Forces Photo Identification Card
- Federally issued firearms license
- A signed credit card issued by a member of the Canadian Payments Association
- A provincial health insurance card where permitted by law. (In Ontario, Manitoba, PEI, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick provincial health cards may not be used for identification purposes. In Quebec, a provincial health card may not be requested, but may be used if offered.)
- Record of Landing (Citizenship and Immigration Canada Form IMM1000.)
- Temporary Resident Permit (Citizenship and Immigration Canada Form IMM1442.)
- Confirmation of Permanent Residence (Citizenship and Immigration Canada Form IMM5292.)
- Canadian Institute for the Blind (CNIB) client card with a photograph.
